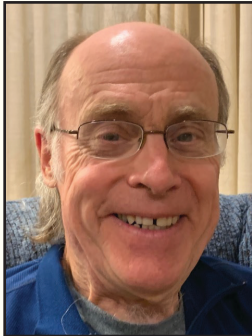


# RIVERBAY Happenings #47

Our featured speaker at this year's Annual Meeting will be Tim Wood, Editor of *The Cape Cod Chronicle*, the Chatham-based independent weekly newspaper covering the Lower Cape. Tim is a graduate of the University of Connecticut.


Tim has written for many regional publications and won awards for his work at the Chronicle. He is the author of "Breakthrough: The story of Chatham's North Beach" and a leader of historic walks through downtown Chatham. Most recently, Tim is the creator of "No Refuge: Cape Cod's Coastal Crisis" - a cautionary film documentary which recounts the story of how climate change transformed the Monomoy National Wildlife Refuge at Morris Island. This will be of interest to all Riverbay homeowners.

The Riverbay Annual Meeting will also include brief reports from the Association's Executive Committee regarding membership, events, finances and beautification. We will offer an presentation to introduce and explain the new online platform. In addition, there will be a period for members to ask questions and make suggestions for Riverbay.
