I have a few brief updates to give based on inquiries, concerns and questions that have been recently received via emails and personal contacts from members. I believe that they are best answered by sending this update to the entire membership. In the future, I plan to follow this same format by keeping all members informed through these Riverbay Feedback updates.

- The Association would like to remind our neighbors and visitors who are dog owners that it is important to pick up after their dog. We live in a highly-walked neighborhood, and it is imperative to keep it clean.
- It has been reported that there are a couple of dead or damaged trees along the edge of Pickerel Pond. This is Town property. We contacted Chatham Conservation and, at their direction, we informed the Chatham Department of Public Works.
- The Association has also communicated to the DPW about managing the roadside sight lines, particularly around corners. We have provided a list of high priority corners to the DPW.
- Based on requests from members, Riverbay Association will be initiating a trial Members' Bulletin Board capability on our website Riverbay.org. This will be a place where Riverbay members can post information that they believe will be of interest to other members. While the Bulletin Board will be monitored by the Association, the information posted will not be approved, verified or endorsed by the Association. We hope that this capability will enhance communication within our neighborhood. More details will follow.
- To improve traffic safety, the Association reports that STOP traffic signs have been approved by Chatham for placement at two locations in Riverbay: At the intersection of Lakeview and Park Avenues and, as a 4-way stop, at the intersection of Riverview Drive and Chippingstone Road. Installation will take place when weather and scheduling permits.
